Calling all students who like to have fun creatively solving problems as part of a team

Odyssey of the Mind® is an international program where students integrate logical problem solving with creative expression. Through completion of brainteasing challenges and development of original presentations, teams of students (up to 7 per team) work together to produce scripts, props, and costumes to solve creative problems *competitively* — outside and inside the box!

The amount of teams ECC OOTM will have is dependent upon the number of students & parents that wish to be involved. In order for a team to exist, a volunteer head-coach is required. Without a volunteer coach, a team cannot be formed. You don't have to know anything about OOTM but it does require you to hold meetings/practices.

Details:

- Three divisions at ECC: Primary (K-2), Division I (K-5) and Division II (6-8).
- Applicants must submit a written application.
- Students must commit to attending WEEKLY meetings with their coach/team; the frequency (and intensity!) of meetings will likely increase as the competition approaches. Talk to your volunteer coach about their schedule for the season.
- All teams must have a Parent Coach and parents must also be willing to help out at least 5+ hours *per child* as/when needed.

The coach is an overseer and guide for the team, but is not allowed to work ON the project with the kids. Projects are 100% executed by the kids.) Most often, the home of the coach or assistant coach is used as a meeting place for team projects, practice, and storage. The coach, assistant coach, or another parent will need to store project/problem materials leading up to competition) Must attend competition days (Regional - Early/Mid-March, 2025) 2) Assistant coach Similar to coach, but takes a secondary role as coach (Note: teams may also have co-coaches sharing equal responsibility for the team. However, if there is a co-coach, both coaches must do the on-line training.) Helps to oversee meetings with the Coach or if the Coach cannot attend.
